2022 is now well underway and we are experiencing excellent levels of student attendance every day. It's lovely welcoming and farewelling students each day, as well as seeing some great learning happening in classes and around our campus.

Just a note on Covid-19 – should you have a positive case or contact in your immediate family, please notify me as soon as possible so we can be aware of and manage the situation – should this happen, early notification is hugely valued. As always, if your child is unwell with cold, flu, fevers or gastric symptoms, please keep them at home. If you are concerned, please take them to your GP and have them tested.

During these very humid and hot times it is essential we look after ourselves. Please continue to ensure your child has their own named drink bottle and hat and rests well when they can. We are keeping our classrooms well ventilated and can monitor air quality including CO2 levels, temperature and relative humidity.

Traffic at front of the school before and after school – there has been a significant increase in the number of parents dropping their children off at school in the mornings and after school. Before school it is important to be patient, drive slowly when in the turning bay, drive forward as much as possible, and keep traffic flowing. After school, we keep our turning bay free from cars between 2.50 and 3.20 for the buses. Please do not park in the cycle lane, do not double park, and do not stop on the yellow lines. The Countdown carpark is the best place to meet your child after school if you are picking them up with a car.

Visitors to the office – we are getting lots of visitors to the office – which is causing some congestion issues – please only come into school if absolutely necessary. If you do need to come in, please ensure to wait outside if someone is already in our reception area.

New School App and School calendar. It's great to see people using the app to notify us of absences through the app feature. The school calendar is also connected to the app, and we are in the process of adding daily notices and EZ lunch to it too. The school app does not replace our other methods of communication. If you haven't received log in details to install the app, please email admin@ni.school.nz

Over December and January we replaced our student management system (formerly Edge, now eTap) and I do apologise for any inconveniences. It is still possible there are teething issues with the new system, so please bear with us and let us know if something doesn't seem right with communications or functionality.

We did have a parent evening scheduled for 15th February which unfortunately cannot take place at this time – we are looking at the best alternative. This is where we would introduce staff to parents and talk through how things work at NIS.

Sports – the governing body which oversees zone days announced yesterday that there will unfortunately not be any zone days happening under Covid-19 Red level.

Camp – at this stage our school camp in week 10 is still scheduled to proceed. More details will come out around this very soon.

New building project – following on from the appointment of Cook Brothers, they will be setting up their site fencing over the next few days to begin the project – which is exciting news!
