Kia ora all

Checkpoint - we are now over halfway through Term One and have moved from Summer to Autumn. Across the campus there is lots of learning happening every day. Well done to everyone for navigating their way through what's been another unconventional period of time. Since we have moved to Covid-19 response phase 3 you'll have noticed we've slowed down communication, only notifying parents if there is a positive case in their child's class and putting out our regular newsletters. Otherwise, we are living with Phase 3. On any given day we have around a quarter of our students absent – most of whom are isolating as household contacts. Thank you for letting me know when this happens, or if there is a positive case.

It's great to see large numbers of students trialling and participating in a range of sports and cultural activities including basketball, netball, water polo, lunchtime sports, eco warriors, senior and junior concert band, choir, rock bands, kapa haka and ukulele band. There will be much more starting up as we work through the year.

On this, I'd like to share a message that came through earlier this week from the coach of another school's team:

"I am contacting you as I would like to commend the amazing sportsmanship of your Giants basketball team at their game this evening. We had only 3 players show up for the game and therefore had to forfeit, however your boys stepped up and agreed to not only play 4 aside, but lent us a player for each half so that everyone could at least get some court time.

It was an evenly matched game and everyone gave it their all. A special mention to Jimmy and Asher who became our players for a half each, which as we know can be a strange situation to be in, playing against your own team. This was a great game to watch and I know you will be very proud of the way they all represented Northcote Intermediate School".

It's always great to receive feedback – positive or otherwise so we can acknowledge or address if required.

#### Mufti Day – Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March – Gold Coin Donation

Rangitoto Team have been focusing their inquiry on refugees, and in collaboration with our student leaders they have organised a mufti day for Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March, with proceeds going to the Red Cross to support refugees from the conflict in Ukraine.

#### Update on Covid 19

As of Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March, at 11.59pm the length of isolation time will change from 10 days to 7 days.

Household Contacts will need to have a rapid antigen test at day 3 and day 7 of their isolation period. If they become symptomatic, they should also get a test, and if the result is positive, they are required to isolate for seven days from that point.

If a person is isolating and still has symptoms after 7 days, they are advised to stay home until 24 hours after symptoms resolve.

There will be questions around this, particularly from those who may currently be isolating. I aim to put out a new flowchart once more details have been released.

#### New minivan

#### **Education Review Office**

As a trial school for the Education Review Office's new processes, we have been working closely with them for over a year. When the review is completed there will be a public report published, however we have received the feedback that we are 'considered highly functional' with strong self-evaluation, clearly aligned strategic goals and initiatives and have a strong focus on educational outcomes and a strong equity focus. It's been interesting for us to help shape the design of the new methodology that all NZ schools will be reviewed with.

#### An Important Update re School Buses

Tāmaki Makaurau is at the red setting of the COVID-19 Protection Framework. As Omicron spreads, many bus operators are experiencing staff shortages and service cancellations across bus, train, and ferry services.

We (Auckland Transport) are trying our best to make school bus services our priority and run most school bus services to a regular timetable. However, we are expecting to see last-minute cancellations due to the spread of Omicron in the community. Although we're working hard to update cancellations in our systems, there may be some occasions when these are last-minute and can't be communicated in time. We recommend checking service updates on the AT Mobile app/Live Departures.

If any of your bus services do not arrive on time, please liaise with the students, and request them to find or use alternative transport options: <u>https://at.govt.nz/bus-train-ferry/journey-planner/</u>. We apologise for any inconvenience this might cause.

Please make a plan with your child should their bus be cancelled: Is there another bus option? Who is available to pick them up? Is walking home a possibility? If so, which route should they take?

In the meantime, please keep working with us to keep everyone safe.
