Facemasks And Ongoing Health Awareness

As of Tuesday this week, mask wearing is no longer required. There will be some staff and students who choose to continue wearing masks, and we will honour and support their decision around this. Team Sports

On Sunday 4th September our teams departed Northcote en masse for Tauranga to compete in girls basketball, boys football, mixed hockey and netball.



<u>Girls Basketball</u> had a challenging week with a number of close games not going our way. Despite some tough results the team remained positive and were often surrounded by parent support throughout the tournament. Perhaps the highlight on the court was the final game against Baradene College when everything fell into place and the team left AIMS Games on a high with a 20-8 victory. A huge thanks to coach Chelsea Halling who trialled, trained, patched up and motivated our team throughout the event. Thanks also to the fabulous Ms Nathan who managed the team and drove our bus-sized 19-seater van.



Boys Football were our standout team results-wise - finishing pool play undefeated (6 wins and a draw) with a goal differential of +40! We defeated Sacred Heart College 1-0 in the round of 16 to set up a quarter-finals with Rosmini College. In the match we scored first early and led before Rosmini levelled mid-game. The second half was very even until a deflected shot from Rosmini bounced off the top of the goal and went back into play where

it was put into the back of the net by Rosmini's striker. The reaction was interesting as even a couple of random older gentleman walking past the goal at the time had their hands in the air confused about why the goal had been awarded given it had gone out of play. After that, both teams had further opportunities but failed to convert so the match finished 1-2 to Rosmini. Our team won their final games to finish a very credible 5th overall with just a single loss over the five days. 


