With 12 school days to go until the end of the year we still have LOTS to do. This is a big project and there will be some class movements next week to accommodate this. Our enviro hub new build and sports/PE shed refurbishment are almost completed, and we have 2 large murals scheduled over the next month. Construction will start this weekend for new accessiblility carparks down our driveway and the driveway will have further work to reseal it once school finishes. Every day we see more deliveries of big pieces of our

new 2 storey block. Last Friday the front steps arrived – weighing in at over 17 tons. it's a BIG project.
