We have been able to confirm this term's field trips that will offer all students the opportunity to go to either Rangitoto Island or Rotoroa Island. Information specific to classes will be sent out through teachers and teams.

Learning in Term 4 will see maths focusing on Algebra, Statistics and Measurement. Literacy will be focusing on narratives and spelling, and inquiry's overarching themes will be digital technology and our local curriculum. Students will be creating a digital piece to share their learning and understanding of an element of Northcote's history. Later in the term we will be hosting our NIS Digi-con exhibition.

#### **MATHS SURVEY**

Our teachers benefit from professional development from Massey University for DMIC (Developing Mathematical Inquiry Communities) to promote teaching mathematics through group problem-solving. This professional development is possible through funding from the Ministry of Education. The MoE has requested that we do Teacher and Student Surveys to provide key information to them.

The Research Team for DMIC is also wanting to use the same surveys (so the surveys are still only done once) to analyse our progress and adjust our programme where we think this is needed. Each school that receives DMIC ICS is required to do the surveys by MoE.

You can find <u>here</u> the Parent Information sheet and <u>here</u> the Student Opt-Out form for any students or parents of students who do not want their child's data to be used for our research purposes. The students still complete the survey for the MoE, but can opt out of their responses being used for our research (a reminder to parents this is an OPT OUT form, not a consent form).
