


TERM 2, WEEK 8

Coeliac Awareness, a Student's Story

Alice Moorehead, One of our Year 8 students, has written an article about her experience having been recently diagnosed with Coeliac Disease. It was Coeliac Disease Awareness Week in June and we wanted to share her story to help raise awareness in the community.

I'm a real shortie. In fact, I have been the shortest in my class, Every. Single. Year.

Hi, my name is Alice, and I'm 12 years old, and did I mention I am quite short for my age? I was diagnosed with Coeliac Disease in 2024, and life hasn't been the same since. I mean, I used to be able to eat whatever I wanted, like pies, yummy, hot, steaming mincey cheesy crispy... oh, sorry, I must have gotten carried away, anyway, where was I? Oh yes, I used to be able to go to cafes and order what I wanted without having to think about anything.

For me, when I eat gluten I get very bad stomach pains. I like to call it a Coeliac Attack. One time it was so bad I had to go to StarShip Hospital overnight, and they considered giving me Morphine! (Apparently Morphine is a very strong medicine, but for me medicine is all the same, yucky!!). But at the time of these attacks, we had no idea it was Coeliac, and it wasn't even mentioned.

The only reason I found out that I had Coeliac disease was because my parents were concerned that I wasn't growing enough. So we visited our family doctor, and she recommended going to a paediatrician, who told us to get some blood tests. One of them was of course the coeliac test (not wanting to scare you, but the needle they stabbed into my arm was unusually big and let's just say I'm glad I won't have to do that again for a while). Then when we got the blood test back it came back positive for coeliac disease - it was such a surprise, I didn't really know what Coeliac Disease was. Next, Mum, Dad, and I, all went to get a gastroscopy to confirm the diagnosis (actually, it was only me who got one that day, but they came with me).

Since being diagnosed with coeliac and changing my diet to be gluten free, I have gone from the 2nd to the 9th percentile in my height range which, for me, is a **big** thing. And I haven't had any more stomach pains either.

Discovering I have Coeliac Disease and making changes to what and how I eat has been really hard but my parents have tried to make it easier by encouraging me to experiment with different ways to make the foods I love, such as biscuits and cupcakes (not always a win). I know that I am lucky to have been diagnosed early so that I can try to live the best way for me.

High School/College Enrolments

For those of you with a child in Year 8 – the High School/College enrolment season starts soon. If you have not already decided, please take it upon yourselves to make an informed decision around which school you will enrol your child at. Make the time to attend open days/evenings, and ask reliable people questions that are important for you to find the best school for your child. If applying out-of-zone for a school, ensure you have your application in before the due date.
