AUT LitPlus Research at NIS

In class wee are participating in research being conducted by Dr John Milne of AUT University. Here is a letter from Dr Milne in relation to this research:

Kia ora koutou,

Different people read in different ways, and we want to understand more about this. This research, led by **Dr John**Milne from AUT LitPlus, aims to find out which ways of reading young people use most, and how these connect to whether or not they enjoy reading.

We know that enjoying reading matters — people who enjoy it tend to read more often, and reading more is linked to many positive outcomes, including doing better at school, developing stronger social relationships, improved wellbeing, and other important life skills.

In this research, we want to hear from everyone — both those who enjoy reading and those who don't. It doesn't matter whether you think you're a strong reader or not; in fact, it's just as important to hear from people who don't see themselves as good readers.

If you take part, you'll be given a short survey with a few questions about yourself (but not your name or any personal identifying details). Then you'll read some short descriptions of different reading styles and let us know how much each one sounds like you. The whole process will take just 10–15 minutes.

Taking part is your choice.

If you decide you do not want to participate, you do not have to. Simply let your teacher know, and you will not be included in the survey.

Your contribution will help Dr John Milne and the AUT LitPlus team better understand how to teach reading in ways that encourage more people to enjoy it.
