2026 - 2028 NIS Strategic Plan

For a few months now we have been working away behind the scenes to draft the 2026 - 2028 NIS Strategic Plan and have gathered and included input from the community, students, staff, the previous school board, and our current school board. Our latest draft is included in this newsletter for your information. We believe it covers a broad range of important areas that we should be focusing on to ensure our students are prepared to be successful, healthy and proud. Once this is finalised, we will follow this up with an annual action plan, which is already in draft form, that will give effect to the strategic plan and enable us to stay focused and use our resources wisely.

Proposed Removal of the Statutory Requirement to give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi

Having been through a robust process in designing our next Strategic Plan, Northcote Intermediate School confirms our ongoing willingness to continue to honour our commitment to Te Tiriti. Our strategic plan clearly states, as our previous plan also stated, that we will 'Honour our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi', and that we will 'strive to ensure Te Ao Māori is thriving, Māori students are succeeding and that we foster kaitiakitanga for our school and whenua'. We are confident that continuing to lock this in to our school's guiding document is the right thing to do for our school and for the community. Our commitment extends to all whānau in our diverse community. NIS proudly serves a community enriched by diverse cultures, perspectives and experiences. This diversity is central to our vision - 'to empower, learn and grow together' and our core values of whakaute - respect for yourself, others and our environment. Ultimately, we will be letting our actions do our speaking.

Curriculum Update

There have been numerous updates and changes in the curriculum space over the last 2 years, and implementing these continues to provide challenges for schools across the country. While we are well-placed to proactively manage these, our dedicated and passionate teachers and curriculum leaders are feeling the pressure of the speed and quantity of changes. We are also awaiting the release of information on the new assessment tools and reporting guidance, and will appraise these as soon as we can. We have set aside time for our teachers to engage in further professional development before school starts in 2026. Ultimately, we commit to doing our best to put our students at the centre of what we do as we navigate this changing landscape.

Students going to Countdown next door before school

The staff at Countdown are starting to become very frustrated with a large number of our students who are going in before school, doing dumb things, and so are we - many are loading up with piles of lollies, sugary drinks and general junk food. We are a water-only school and do our best to ensure students are eating healthy food. We offer a breakfast club at school and any student who is unable to bring their own food can make lunch here. If you are giving your child money to go to the supermarket to buy their lunch we suggest you change strategies - send them to the nearby bakery or set your own expectations around this in line with ours. We risk a complete ban for our students from Countdown if this continues.

Students in Online Chat Groups

We are seeing another surge of students involved in groups on platforms such as Snapchat, Whatsapp, Messenger. The standard minimum age for these accounts is 13. There is also a ban on student mobile devices used at school. These groups happen after hours but issues can very easily come into the school and cause problems. Please check with your child what they have access to - as parents/caregivers you are their legal guardians and as such, responsible for what they have access to outside of school hours.

Changes to Straight Year Levels in 2026

After trialling both composite and straight year-level classes and teams, we have decided that the best format for NIS moving ahead is to move to straight year levels. There will be some of this year's Year 7's affected by this, and we will communicate changes to classes and teachers when we have confirmed details. What we can confirm is that from the start of 2026 on, Kawau will all be Year 7 classes, Rangitoto will all be Year 8 classes, Motutapu will be Year 7, Tiriti Tiriti Matangi will be Year 7, Aotea and Rakino will be Year 8 classes. As such, there will be some Year 7 students who will need to be shifted. We will confirm this as soon as possible.

Pasifika Connect Evening

Our Pasifika Connect group of Y7/Y8 students have been diligently preparing to showcase their cultures on the evening of Thursday 27 November. Under the guidance of Cathy Lio and Rachelle Payne, Pasifika Connect have been performing throughout the year at our assemblies. They will also be performing at the Onepoto festival this Friday.

Whanau Connect Evening

Next Wednesday 26th November 5-8pm, Pasifika parents are invited to an informal evening to connect with other caregivers. There will be an opportunity to play sports and chat on the sidelines.

Recent Fundraising Efforts

We are really fortunate to have such a culture of caring in our community and a willingness to dig deep to help others. Recent events have raised over \$3000 to go towards Mental Health and the Special Children's Christmas Party.
